FR. TODY'S MESSAGE FOR THIS LIEEK

Dear sisters/brothers; parishioners of St. Thomas More and St. Bernadette,

Theme: "Blessed are they who realize they can't depend on material things for happiness and, as a result, put all their trust in God."

Our Readings: First Reading: Jer. 17. 5-8; "To put all one's trust in human strength leads to frustration. Let us trust in the Lord and find fulfillment.".

Psalm Response: "Blessed the one who trusts in the Lord."

Second Reading: 1 Cor. 15. 12, 16-20: "If our hope in Christ is limited to this life only, we are the most pitiable of human beings."

Gospel: Luke 6. 17, 20-26: "happiness and blessings are the rewards of those who accept the Gospel and the Saviour. Sorrow and woe await those who take wealth and pleasure as their goal in life."

As part of our Jubilee Year Journey of Hope theme we continue to have our Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Holy Hour before the 4:00 PM mass every Saturday. It is Jesus' invitation to come and pray the Chaplet of the Divine Mercy and the Holy Rosary. The Chaplet of the Divine Mercy was approved by St. John Paul II, a prayer taught to St. Faustina to be prayed especially at 3:00 PM as the hour of great mercy when our Lord Jesus died on the cross for us. During this Jubilee year, please come and spend some time with the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

We are also encouraged to visit areas or places of encounter with the Lord, we call Shrines or Holy Places. As I mentioned that our diocese of Peterborough designated four churches as places of pilgrimage with special indulgence. First is the Cathedral of St. Peter-in-Chains as the seat of the Diocese. Our chance to be there would be during the Chrism Mass which will be held on the Monday of Holy Week when all the priests in the diocese will gather and renew the different promises made during ordination, the blessing of the different oils for the different sacraments and sacramentals. In the Southern deanery is St. Michael's Church in Cobourg, the central deanery is St. Mary's Church in Lindsay and the gathering was last February 2nd. In the northern deanery, St. Patrick's Church in Kearney is also chosen as a pilgrim Church. As a Diocese we also have a day of pilgrimage to the Martyr's shrine in Midland.

To visit a shrine is also suggested and what are these? Shrines are erected either to protect relics or to commemorate the presence of God in a particular place at a particular time. The Directory on Popular Piety and the Liturgy says that they can also have a deep significance as 'signs of cosmic harmony and reflections of divine beauty because of their physical positioning' (paragraph 263). Some are placed over the grave of a saint, while others, like the Oratory of St. Joseph in Montreal, are built on the faith of a visionary. These can be privileged places to ask for God's help or to give thank for favours received. They are often the object of pilgrimage.
